  - o 8 10 people needed to make an impact on the neighborhood
  - o 20 people would be most effective
- Summer Start and End Time: 8am 11am
  - o That way, volunteers won't get overheated.
- S&WB will Lend the Following Tools:
  - o Trash Bags, markers, & glue to facilitate easy cleaning & marking
  - \* \* Volunteers are encouraged to bring and wear gloves
